A Word from the President

Kingswood 2.0



I still remember the look of surprise on mom's face. The curtain had just fallen on our high school musical in which I had played one of the leading roles. She wondered aloud how someone who could memorize so many lines and lyrics could still forget to take out the trash.

Mom was very proud; she was just seeing a side of me she hadn't expected.

Something like this is happening at Kingswood University. Before our eyes it has developed into something surprising. We're calling it Kingswood 2.0.

Ten years ago, we were entirely campus-based. Now we have students across North America as well as in Sussex. All our oncampus programs can be taken fully online. Meanwhile, our Sussex campus continues to produce Christ-like servant leaders who have been nurtured in a "sanctifying context."

For most of our 80-year history, we employed one way of teaching: professor and students together in a physical classroom. Now Kingswood students also study through distance education at their own pace, in virtual classrooms, in hybrid mentored cohorts, and through competency-based education.

A decade ago, our primary product was undergraduate pastoral training. This is still our "bread and butter" program, but we also have degrees in Counselling, Business Management, and Marketplace Ministry. We've embraced the philosophy that you can minister as a vocation, but also through a vocation.

We have always had a small international presence among our student body. By this time next year, thanks to our partnership with Crandall University, Kingswood will have a much more multicultural flavour.

Just seven years ago, all our programs were credit bearing. Now, through Kingswood Extended, we also offer non-degree certificates to help people prepare for ministry and ordination. As well, we offer free non-degree micro courses through Kingswood Learn, allowing people to enrich their lives and their local churches.

Our mission hasn't changed: to serve the church by training Christ-like servant leaders. But today we do this in ways barely imagined only a decade ago.

In this issue you'll hear more about Kingswood 2.0. We'll introduce you to new staff and hear from current students. We'll explain how we're serving the church through Kingswood Extended and provide an exciting update on the amazing progress of Kingswood Learn.

As you learn more about what God is doing through Kingswood 2.0, we think you'll be pleasantly surprised.

Expanding Presence of Kingswood 2.0

Going Into All the World

Kingswood University is growing! Through its on-campus programs, its online offerings via Kingswood Extended, and the growing number of users on Kingswood Learn, Kingswood's mission to form Christ-like servant leaders is expanding. Over 1100 people are now being directly impacted, including over 300 in our certificate programs and nearly 700 taking microcourses through Kingswood Learn. In recent years, the offerings of Kingswood across these platforms have reached 27 countries outside of Canada and the U.S., as well as 7 Canadian provinces and 45 American states.

Kingswood Learn

The most recent addition to Kingswood's education offerings is Kingswood Learn. Launched in January, this free platform provides access to high-quality, engaging, thoroughly vetted, and practical micro courses. In addition to its use by nearly 700 individuals, this resource has also been implemented as a group

discipleship tool by local church congregations. All this before it reached its six month birthday.

Pastor Andrew Ross from Houlton Wesleyan, reflecting on his congregation's experience with Kingswood Learn, observes, "It allows congregations to more readily access instruction and teaching insights from qualified leaders. I see the impact being both theological and pastoral. When congregations are able to access high-quality courses, even at the more basic level, it helps feed a hunger many have for going deeper in God's Word and in theology."

Pastor Ryan Genereaux from Woodstock Wesleyan is another leader who has been involved in implementing this resource for a group of about 35 attendees from his church's congregation. Reflecting on the value of this resource, he said, "The courses on Kingswood Learn are a great discipleship tool. One big way I have seen it making an impact is in seeing our people have access to safe, trusted material online."

Kingswood Extended Degree Programs

With about 40 students currently taking degree programs online through Kingswood Extended (KX), Kingswood is providing individuals with a flexible and practical option to train for ministry wherever they are around the globe. This has proven to be a valuable educational tool both for individuals preparing for full-time ministry as well as for those seeking to expand their knowledge out of personal interest.

Cindy Halcrow, an A.A. in Biblical Studies student, shares her story of finding Kingswood Extended, saying, "I have always wanted to go to Bible school, but life, children, and work interrupted that dream. When I retired from a career in public service in 2023, I found myself with a lot of spare time so I started searching for an online program that would increase my knowledge of the Bible. A former pastor at my church recommended Kingswood University and suggested that I look at its online programs. The A.A. in Biblical Studies was exactly what I was looking for."

For Cindy and others like her, Kingswood Extended offers an affordable and accessible way to gain valuable knowledge without uprooting and leaving home to attend in person. Through KX, Kingswood is privileged to make ministry training accessible to people in all stages of life and to those who face obstacles to in-person learning.

Will Harvey, a B.A. in Ministry (Pastoral) student preparing for full-time ministry, says, "Choosing KX to study was one of the best things I did. As a person with a physical disability, it is hard to find a school with a campus that is ergonomically equipped for a wheelchair. It would be different if I were being called somewhere for employment, but a move to study for four or five years would be unfeasible, considering the circumstances. Studying through KX, I can stay in my current home, which I know is ergonomically equipped, and stay connected with my home church family while studying."

Will hopes to go on to teach and pastor others with the knowledge he has gained through his degree. "We all are constrained by what knowledge we have," Will says. "The lack of knowledge can limit us. Before Kingswood Extended, I knew a few biblical truths for right living, the way to salvation, and who Jesus was. I didn't start to understand and learn the ebbs and flows of the Biblical meta-story and how the rest of the Bible relates to that story until I started studying it."

As Will says, lack of knowledge can limit people in both their personal and ministry potential. With Kingswood Extended's increased reach, individuals are growing and developing in ways that might not have been possible without an educational experience that meets them where they are and fits naturally into their everyday lives.

Kingswood Extended Certificate Programs

In addition to degree programs, Kingswood Extended also offers certificate-level courses for ordination and personal development. The most recent numbers show over 300 students enrolled in certificate-level courses through Kingswood Extended. These courses, utilized by individuals in a self-paced format, in hybrid classroom settings, and in mentored cohorts run by local churches, offer an affordable, flexible, and accessible way for people to grow in their personal and ministerial development.

Cyndi Bennett, who just completed a certificate in Biblical Studies through Kingswood Extended, reflects on her experience saying, "My education has already increased my ability to understand, question, research, and teach the Bible. I am certain this will continue as I follow the leadings of the Holy Spirit into the unknown paths God has chosen for me." Cyndi originally began courses through KX because she found herself teaching the Bible in her church and community, and she felt a desire to become a better teacher. Through her KX courses, she grew in understanding and was met by God in powerful and moving ways.

Kingswood Extended certificate-level courses are also being used by churches in hybrid classrooms, combining distance and in-person learning, and through implementing mentored cohorts. One such partnership is with Healing Place Church in Waldorf, Maryland, where a mentored cohort meets every other week for up to three hours. The Kingswood Extended class they are working through currently offers an introduction to the Old Testament, and students in the congregation are given the option of auditing the course or paying to have it count towards a certificate. Rev. Moe Diggs from Healing Place Church says, "I see this impacting our congregation and community by giving them a deeper dive that continues to stir the hunger in their hearts for the Word, as well as theology and leadership training."

Another partnership that is increasing the accessibility of ministry training is the Kickstarter program, an initiative started by the Great Lakes Region (GLR) of the Wesleyan Church in partnership with Kingswood. The GLR's mission is to equip and empower pastors and leaders to seek and save the lost. This mission sparked the formation of Kickstarter, a ministerial development pipeline for those who sense a call to ministry.

Kickstarter uses a network of professors, all from the Great Lakes Region, to run a ministerial training program that is made possible by their partnership with Kingswood Extended. With much of the cost of classes underwritten by the GLR, individuals in their district wanting to pursue ministerial licensing have an affordable and accessible route to do so.

Sherry Laurence from the Great Lakes Region describes the resounding success of this program, saying, "In the little over a year and a half that Kickstarter has been available, we've had over 100 students engage in the Ministerial Development Journey through Kickstarter. By the end of the 2023-24 church year, we are set to have issued initial licensing to nearly 80 pastors, double the number from the year before."

Spiritual Formation at Kingswood



Kingswood's Spiritual Formation Component is an integral part of campus life, creating a culture that prioritizes spiritual disciplines and personal growth. The Spiritual Formation Component features events like chapel services, Evensong, and mentorship cohorts as well as weekly check-ins for students to reflect on what God has been teaching them through both organized events and personal devotions. As we look back on the first year since adding Evensong and mentorship cohorts to the Spiritual Formation Component, we asked a few students to reflect on ways they have seen the Spiritual Formation Component impact their life and spiritual growth.

Catch the Vision



"It's all about catching the vision for what God has created and for what He's creating at Kingswood." That's the way President Steve Lennox describes the purpose for Kingswood's Vision Tours. The very first trip, held in May 1992, was a joint venture with the Best Years Fellowship ministry of The Wesleyan Church. Guests spent three days in and around St. Andrews, New Brunswick, staying at the grand Algonquin Hotel.

Since then, Vision Tour guests have traveled throughout Atlantic Canada, Quebec, and New England, including Newfoundland, Cape Breton, Prince Edward Island, Ottawa, even the Magdalen Islands. "When you have a region as beautiful as ours," says Lennox, "you want to show it off."

In 2020, Vision Tours went international, as President Lennox and Pastor Joel Gorveatte co-led a trip to Israel and Jordan. International trips focus on places important to the Bible and

the history of Christianity. "As a Bible College, it makes sense for us to help people experience the lands of the Bible," Lennox explained.

From the first trip to the present, Vision Tours have been about allowing guests to experience warm Christian fellowship, inspiring "words from the Word," and a great touring experience.

These trips have also proven to be a wonderful way to introduce people to the ministry of Kingswood University. Whenever possible, tours include time on campus, allowing guests to experience a Chapel service and see the beautiful campus first-hand. They also share a meal with students and, if they choose, become a student's prayer partner.

Once introduced, most guests become supporters. Since 1992, 375 households have traveled with Kingswood, the vast majority without any connection to Kingswood before their first trip. Those who came to know Kingswood through a vision tour have given almost \$2 million dollars. Giving from all 375 households now stands at over \$5 million dollars.

Key to the success of this ministry has been Tour Coordinator, Debbie Benson. Guests agree that Debbie strives to provide them with a worry-free trip so they can delight in the wonder of the natural beauty all around. "Many of our guests have served the Lord for years," Debbie says. "I feel privileged to help make this trip a reality for them. They appreciate everything we do!"

These are just some of the blessings made possible at Kingswood University in the past few years thanks to estate gifts. Thoughtful planning has allowed these donors to leave a legacy for future generations.

Surprisingly, most of us do not have an estate plan. According to a recent survey, although 91% of Canadians think wills are important, less than half have one. The situation in the United States is similar. An estate plan, including a will, helps ensure that your wishes will be fulfilled with your resources.

Some think this is only an issue for those who are older and have significant resources. The fact is that an estate plan is a good idea for anyone of any age and any financial situation. Your resources, whether ample or scant, should go where you want them when you're gone.

For many, the problem is uncertainty. They know they should have a plan but aren't sure how. Kingswood University has

recently taken steps to make the process understandable for all. A series of estate planning seminars are being planned for the coming months.

This will be a joint effort between the Camp, Houghton University, the Penn York District of The Wesleyan Church, and Kingswood University. It will feature a presentation from an estate planning attorney and plenty of time for questions.

Another estate planning seminar will be held on Thursday afternoon, July 11, at Beulah Camp and Conference Centre, Browns Flat, NB. This information-packed session is jointly sponsored by the Atlantic District of The Wesleyan Church, Beulah Camp, and Kingswood University.
